

How to:

Extraction Cleaning Of Carpet

Why Extraction?

Extraction cleaning is a restorative method of carpet cleaning. It is designed for removal of deep imbedded soils. However it can also be used as an interim surface cleaning method by adjust the speed of the machine and the flow of the cleaning solution.

Equipment / Materials Needed:

- Extraction Machine
- Pressure Sprayer
- Extraction Shampoo (Husky 1110)
- Pile Brush or carpet rake.
- Fans

Procedure: Rotary Shampooing of Carpet.

1. Vacuum carpet thoroughly and pre-spot.
2. Position wet floor signs.
3. Mix carpet solution according to manufactures directions.
4. Pre spray heavy traffic areas and spots on carpet..
5. Pour defoamer in recovery tank.
6. Move drag tool or all in one extractor backwards keeping a straight line, overlapping each pass. Be careful not to over wet the carpet.
7. To shorten drying times make a second pass over the area with the vacuum on and extract as mush moisture as possible.
8. For high pile carpet, use a carpet rake or a pile brush to brush the carpet against the pile.
9. Use fans to speed up drying.
10. When dry, vacuum area.
11. Clean up equipment and return to storage.

Fact:

An extremely important aid in care of carpets is walk off mats. With the proper size floor mat they can remove up to 80% of the soil before it reaches the tile or carpet.
